FINSBURY BASH CANCELLED

The New Year's Eve Concert at Finsbury Park, featuring House Of Love, Lush, and The Family Cat has been cancelled at the eleventh hour. Promoters of the event, The Mean Fiddler, say that new conditions imposed by the police mean that the concert is now no longer viable. Mean Fiddler boss Vince Power says he's furious and is accusing Tottenham Police of having a "total lack of understanding" about the event.

He said: "The council received a letter from the police on Friday recommending that they impose a new condition on the licence stating that they wouldn't allow any tickets for the event to be sold after December 28. They wouldn't let us set up a box office at the site for day sales either."

The Mean Fiddler refused to say how many tickets they'd sold for the concert. However, it's known that they were relying on a lot of ticket sales on the night.

"We were expecting a large walk-up on the night obviously," a spokesman for the venue told the Maker. "A lot of people obviously wouldn't buy a ticket until the night just in case there was a New Year's party to go to."

However, the concert had been attacked for its high ticket prices. The Wonder Stuff pulled out two weeks ago with singer Miles Hunt claiming: "The last thing we wanted to do was a Wonder Stuff headline gig in London at that kind of ticket price."
